### OUR FRIENDS ARE GOLDEN





## Message from the **Board President**

In 1972, Community Link was chartered as a not-for-profit corporation by the state of Illinois. A team of 27 participants and six staff members had set up a satellite of the Kaskaskia Workshop in Carlyle, Illinois. Originally known as the Clinton County Rehabilitation Center, they quickly became popular and grew out of that first location. In the decades since, the Adult Day Program moved to Breese and expanded to Fairview Heights. Infants and families have been served through Early Head Start and Children's Learning Programs. Residents moved into our Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA) homes. Then recently, we opened the Red Porch Café in New Baden.

That is a very simple summary of the past 50 years of Community Link, but those years have been anything but simple. So many individuals, our friends, family and neighbors, have been impacted by the programs of Community Link. I am proud to be a part of this organization that has endured and served for so long.

As much as we have enjoyed looking back and celebrating 50 years of possibilities, our focus now is looking to the future. The unprecedented challenges of recent years forced us to approach obstacles differently and focus on what is most important every day. In 2022, we have been happily reconnecting with our friends and community. We have resumed many activities of the past and are expanding program offerings.

In 2023, we will continue to modify programs as we implement the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) settings rule. The federal rule highlights informed choices, decision making, and community inclusion. In many ways, the new protocols will strengthen the person-centered values that we already uphold. Individuals will have even more autonomy and independence in making life choices.

I am grateful to the talented staff who work tirelessly to ensure that our participants are living their best lives. On behalf of the entire board, I'd also like to thank our dedicated families and generous friends who continue to support our mission to offer opportunities for growth and independence for all individuals.
